The Complex Chronic Diseases Program (CCDP) is a multidisciplinary program that treats patients with Lyme disease, Fibromyalgia and Myalgic Encephalomyelitis /Chronic Fatigue Syndrome. Reporting to the Medical Director of the CCDP and the Department Head, Anesthesia, Family Practice, Medicine, or Pediatrics as appropriate at BC Women's Hospital and Health Centre, the physician will assume both clinical responsibility for patients and participation in the educational, academic, and provincial mandates of the newly established Complex Chronic Diseases Program at BC Women's Hospital and Health Centre.

We are currently seeking multiple physicians to enhance our interdisciplinary team within the CCDP. In this role, you will apply current research evidence and best practice standards to address the medical needs of patients referred to the CCDP. The position will require you to be innovative, accountable, and deliver quality care in accordance with established policies and philosophies. The scope of your duties will extend to participation in major clinical activities and research within the hospital.

Candidates will be registered with or eligible for registration with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia or the College of Naturopathic Medicine of British Columbia. They will have specialty training in one or more of the following areas: Internal Medicine, Rheumatology, Infectious Diseases, Physiatry, Neurology, Psychiatry, Anesthesiology, Pediatrics and its relevant subspecialties, Naturopathic Medicine, or Family Medicine with subspecialty interest/training in complex chronic medicine. The ideal candidate will also have or be eligible for a faculty appointment at the University of British Columbia or equivalent.
